COVID-19 Protection Resolution

WHEREAS the governor of the state of Washington Jay Inslee issued STAY HOME-STAY HEALTHY Proclamation 02-25 on March 23, 2020, prohibiting all non-essential business services.

WHEREAS Grays Harbor Conservation District (District) services may be classified as essential as identified by the Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers appendix to Proclamation 02-25.

NOW THEREFORE, the District Board of Supervisors puts forth the following COVID-19 Protection Resolution to protect health and well being during performance of essential District services.

NOW THEREFORE, any District services that are deemed as essential under Proclamation 02-25 will have documentation that denotes how and why the work is essential.


NOW THEREFORE, any District services that are deemed essential will follow the latest COVID-19 workplace protection guidance from the State of Washington Department of Health and the CDC.

This guidance includes but is not limited to:


- Any employees who are sick must stay home.
- To the extent possible, teleworking will be utilized to perform District services.
- When performing essential services that cannot be accomplished by teleworking, employees will follow social distancing guidelines, minimize performing work in the proximity of others, and practice good health habits.
